

FUNDING TURF ADVANCEMENTS #12: Annual Golf Classic for Fundraising and Fun!

The New Jersey Turfgrass Association (NJTA) is proud to support the Rutgers Center for Turfgrass Science by providing funding for research endeavors, student scholarships, staff salaries, needed equipment, building/farm repairs, and much more. One way the non-profit organization raises money is the annual Golf Classic.

Twenty-four years ago, the inaugural NJTA Golf Classic took place on one course and raised between \$10-\$15 thousand dollars. The annual event has grown exponentially. The 2019 affair spanned all three golf courses at Fiddler's Elbow Country Club and raised about \$100,000 to help advance the turfgrass industry!

"This is the largest number of pre-registered golfers we've ever had," said NJTA Board Member and Rutgers instructor Dr. Karen Plumley. "That's an all-time high and means that we pretty much had two foursomes on every hole on all three 18-hole courses."

Already thinking about next year's big event, the chair of the golf classic committee, Shaun Barry, never loses sight of what the pomp and circumstance honors.

"It is the biggest one-day turfgrass research fundraiser in the world," he said. "We are here to celebrate the positive effects that come from the work of the Rutgers Center for Turfgrass Science."

Steven McDonald, Rutgers instructor and owner of Turfgrass Disease Solutions, LLC, said, "This is my favorite event of the year because it directly benefits turf research and science."



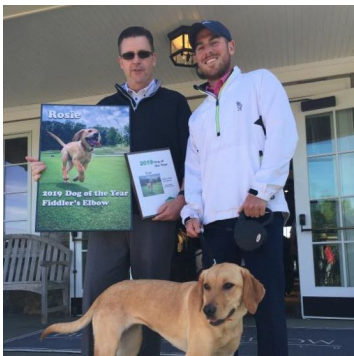
